LACSS and Baldwin Hills Elementary School

For the last two years, LACSS members have generously donated many succulent cuttings to the Skirball Planting project. This project is intended to introduce young kids to the concept of recycle, reduce and repurpose. The Director of this project, Jenny, invited me to join her on her most recent venture. I had been out of town and couldn't get the word out to our members in a timely manner so Jenny scrambled around, trimmed a few of her plants and procured some from her office staff. This, in addition to visiting various thrift stores, garage sales, etc to find items that would serve as planters for the succulents. (This is the *repurpose* portion of their program.) Not all plants need to be in a pot. Cups and bowls work well, also, even though they do not have drainage holes.

Off we went to Baldwin Hills Elementary School to meet with 50+ second graders. They all knew about the drought and what "drought" meant. They also knew about succulent plants! My job was to explain how to plant the cuttings and explain the importance of proper watering. What energy! What enthusiasm! And they asked some very good questions!!

Our hope, of course, is that we sparked the interest of at least one child who will pursue a career in botany, environmental sciences, horticulture, or maybe even succulents.

A fun time was had by all and we will do it again someday......Joyce
